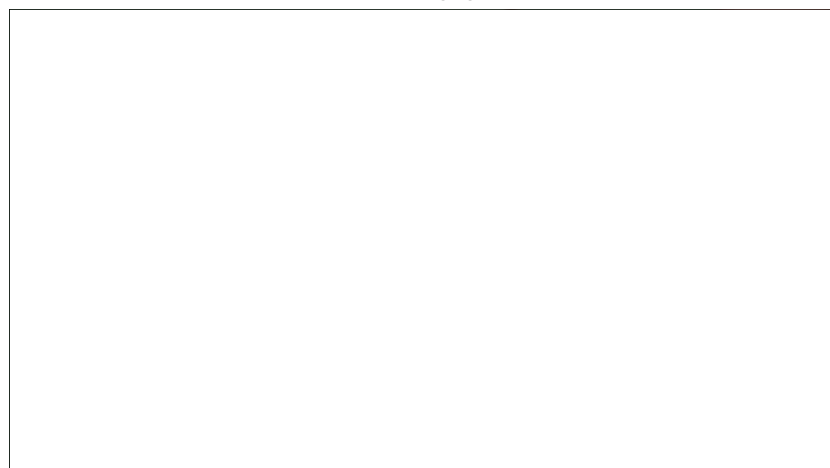

Amid college basketball’s March Madness playoffs, Meatpacking District art space Fort Gansevoort has launched a sports-themed exhibition called “March Madness” — with works by [Jeff Koons](#), Robert Longo, Gordon Parks, Raymond Pettibon and Alex Israel.
